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Overview of Program

The Health Care Studies Program is designed for students interested in entering the health care profession. The Program provides students with the foundational courses necessary to either enter one of the College's other health care programs, or, for interested students, transfer to bachelor degree programs in the health sciences fields such as nursing, health information management, occupational therapy and speech therapy. The program also enables students to graduate with an A.A. degree in Health Care Studies. While in the Program students may also opt to obtain a proficiency certificate to enhance their knowledge and skills of a particular area in health care and to increase their employment opportunities upon graduation from the College.

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of this program, students will be able to:

- Communicate effectively with others orally and in writing.
- Demonstrate quantitative reasoning skills, particularly as they apply to the health care setting.
- Explain the factors that influence health and disease.
- Explain social and psychological factors that influence human behavior.
- Define a career goal and outline the academic process required to reach that goal.

Program Entry Requirements

Students are typically required to take the College's placement tests at their time of entry. Students identified as needing developmental course work must satisfactorily complete the appropriate English and mathematics courses as a part of the degree program.

Program of Study and Graduation Requirements:

To qualify for the A.A. Degree in Health Care Studies, students must complete a minimum of 60 credit hours as prescribed, attain a 2.0 cumulative grade point average and complete all course and credit requirements with no grade below a "C" in any course.

HCSP Pathways and Course Grids

Students in the Health Care Studies Program may choose **one of five pathways** to follow. Students interested in internal or external transfer should follow the **Transfer Pathway** illustrated in the grid below.

The Transfer Pathway is appropriate for students whose primary goal is:

- to move into the College's nursing program
- to move into one of the College's other health care programs such as:
 - Clinical Laboratory Technology
 - o Dental Hygiene
 - Diagnostic Medical Imaging
 - o Health Services Management
 - o Respiratory Care Technology
- to transfer to a health care program at a four-year university such as:
 - health information management
 - o nursing
 - o nutrition
 - o occupational therapy
 - public health
 - o speech therapy
 - o therapeutic recreation

*** All students must have a minimum of 60 credits in order to graduate. Depending on courses selected above, the number of general electives required will vary.

If the student would like to graduate from the college with the Health Care Studies Degree and seek immediate employment in the health care sector, one of four pathways may be chosen: **Clinical Assistant**, **Medical Insurance Billing**, **Ophthalmic Technician** or **Patient Service Representative**. In each case, elective and selective courses are chosen to complete a proficiency certificate that shows that the student has taken the coursework necessary to join the health care workforce upon graduation. In the grids below, courses in bold must be chosen to earn the proficiency certificate within the Health Care Studies curriculum.

Clinical Assistant Pathway

Clinical Assistants are professionals that perform clinical procedures that include: obtaining patient medical histories; taking vital signs; administering medications; performing electrocardiography; vision screening; assisting the physician with general and specialty examinations; performing point-of-care laboratory testing. Clinical Assistants may serve as a patient advocate and health coach to patients. Professional settings that offer career opportunities to the Clinical Assistant include: outpatient clinics, physicians'; offices, and other health care facilities.

Medical Insurance Billing Pathway

Medical Insurance Billing Specialists are professionals that prepare, submit, and/or process insurance claims for doctor's offices, hospitals, extended care facilities, diagnostic centers, insurance companies and other health related facilities. Professional settings that offer career opportunities to the Medical Insurance Billing Specialist include: outpatient clinics, physicians' offices, medical laboratories, insurance companies, skilled nursing facilities, home health care agencies and independent billing agencies.

Ophthalmic Technician Pathway

Ophthalmic technicians work with optometrists and/or ophthalmologists to provide patient care by performing many different eye-related clinical functions. Ophthalmic technicians assist optometrists and/or ophthalmologists care for patients by taking medical histories, performing various administrative duties such as scheduling appointments, telephone management, bookkeeping procedures and insurance claim processing. Ophthalmic technicians may work in optometry practices, ophthalmology practices or health care clinics, optical dispensaries, optical laboratories, health care and optical equipment businesses and pharmaceutical companies.

Patient Service Representative Pathway

The Patient Service Representative is responsible for greeting patients and families, collecting demographic and insurance information, scheduling patients according to the provider's guidelines and protocols, collecting payments associated with services rendered and any other duties necessary to provide efficient, timely services to the patients and their families. The Patient Service Representative has the opportunity to seek employment in a variety of health care settings.

Allied Health 101: Introduction to the Health Care Professions

Students interested in a health care profession have many career options to choose from. The Health Care Studies Program was designed to guide that decision making process and the academic mapping that is required to reach the chosen career. Student success is optimized with a clear goal and a defined academic process to reach that goal.

All new Health Care Studies students are required to take AH 101: Introduction to the Health Care Professions before they have earned 12 college credits. It is recommended that students who transfer into the program take AH 101 during their first semester in the Health Care Studies Program. Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- identify the essential qualities and behaviors of health care professionals such as critical thinking, problem-solving, punctuality and time management skills.
- describe the roles and responsibilities of individual members of the health care team.
- explain how to communicate effectively in respect to cultural, social and ethnic differences in the health care environment.
- demonstrate an understanding in performing medical math, taking vital signs, maintaining infection control standards and using medical terminology.
- develop an academic plan, career transfer plan and an e-portfolio.

This exciting course will allow students to begin their pathway to a career in health care!
