- **STEP 1 - - What we offer**
 - ✓ Visit us online at www.ccp.edu
 - ✓ Take a look at the programs and courses we offer to our students.
 - ✓ Look through our tuition and fees section
 - ✓ Dual Admissions provides a chance to successfully transfer credits and work toward a Bachelors' degree through our partnerships with local Universities.

- **STEP 2 - - Complete an Admissions Application**
 - ✓ Apply online at www.ccp.edu or

- **STEP 3 - - Explore Financial Aid Options**
 - ✓ Check out the U.S. Department of Education website at www.fafsa.ed.gov to file your application.
 - ✓ Visit www.ccp.edu to read about financial aid options and view the 2007-2008 users guide or
 - ✓ Stop by Main Campus or Regional Center to pick up the financial aid brochure.
 - ✓ Call us at 215.751.8270 when you have more questions.

- **STEP 4 - - Activate your MyCCP student account**
 - ✓ You need to activate your MyCCP account to communicate with the College and for the College to communicate with you.
 - ✓ You will have an email account to email friends, family or co-workers.
 - ✓ You will receive emails from the College through your account about next steps in Admissions, Financial Aid, Testing and Registration.

- **STEP 5 - - Take the Placement Test**
 - ✓ You have to take the placement test (reading, math and English) to see what classes you need to take first.
 - ✓ Check out the placement test page to see practice questions with answers.
 - ✓ It is NOT a pass or fail test.
 - ✓ Log into your student website, **MyCCP**, look at the placement test channel to see if you qualify for a test waiver.

- **STEP 6 - - Register for classes**
 - ✓ Meet with a counselor or advisor to talk about your test scores and program of study.
 - ✓ Create your class schedule.
 - ✓ Buy your books.
 - ✓ Attend orientation before classes start.
